


Your Independents for Frome candidate is Mark Dorrington

Independents for Frome

IfF is a group of local people who care about our community and want to do the best for Frome. For the last 7 years we have run the town council as a group with differing ideas and no allegiance to any political party.

What we've achieved:

IfF set up and funds Fair Frome which last year delivered over 10 tons of food parcels to local people in need. We created Frome Voluntary Car Club, which now has 30 drivers helping over 300 people who find it hard to get around.

We have reclaimed and manage over 40 acres of new open space for Frome (including the Old Showfield and the Dippy).

In 2017 we saved the old Town Hall and now share it with groups like WHY and Active and In Touch, with facilities available to the whole community. In the last year alone the IfF led council has funded over 40 local voluntary groups and set aside almost £200,000 for such work.

We listened to what Frome residents want for the Market Place and are delivering the aims of Vision for Frome's Community Plan. This year we will make more improvements to sort out the bus stops and consider courtesy crossings.

The persistence and ambition of the IfF council has finally led to action on Saxonvale. The site is being cleaned up and the way is now clear for future development.

Despite a harsh economic climate our Independent Council has made possible over £2m of new investment in Frome.
